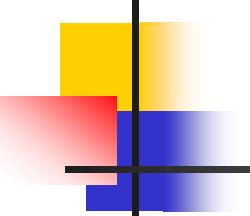

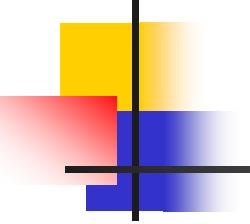

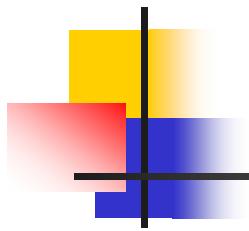
Concepts and methods

Climate change: linguistic aspects of a paradoxical expression

- Lexical analysis – semantic selection (*change – climate*)
- Technical terms – part of common discourse
- The success of *eco-language*



Climate change, energy transition: the semantics of *sobriety*




Dramatisation - scientific vulgarisation


The storytelling effect: a story, with his screenplay, suspens, classic theater acts (risks: make climate change a fiction)

- Double paradoxal effect: banalisation of climate change but a specific dramatisation;
- **Finding solutions becomes the principal moment of the story: humankind survival can depend on it**



- A lexical specificity: the challenge (scientific vulgarisation corpus of 2008)
